



## HISTORIC REFURBISHMENT GAINS STEAM-FREE BATHROOM MIRRORS

Steam-free mirrors with heated mirror pads by *demista™* were an integral feature in the recent upgrading of the residential accommodation at the historic Royal Society of Medicine building in London opened in 1912 by King George V and Queen Mary.

The entire project involved the upgrade of 41 bedrooms to 5-star standard, including new bathrooms with *demista™*, air conditioning and temperature controlled rooms.
